to 3 Last Will &c

I Samuel Cary of Fayette Co State of West Va - farmer
being of sound mind do make and publish this my
last will and testament as follows;

I will two cows and a yearling heifer, one yoke of work cattle, two horses
four sheep, two hogs great and small, all my farming utensils including
a wagon five swarms of bees all the hold and kitchen furniture for
the use and benefit of my house family not to be given away, lent or
hired to leave the farm

I will to my son George Thomas the young colt, I will that all other
personal property except money, tools, grain and feed be sold at my death
I will to my son George Thomas the following described tract of land to wit:
Beginning at a blazed white oak near the corner of A. Harrows field above
and near the road, thence to a gum near and above the ford of creek
between my house and A. Carys house, thence a straight line nearly
West to an apple tree at the corner of lot around the house in which
S. E. Cary now lives, thence, a straight line along the top of ridge to my

out side line on the top of the mountain, thence with top of mountain to A. Early line, thence with A. Early line and lines of lands of G. McLeung and A. Harrow to the beginning;

I will to my daughter Lydia Frances the following described tract of land to wit: Beginning at a spruce pine corner to my land and lands of Black Harrow thence nearly South West to the fork of the creek between my house and house of Eliza Harrow, thence up the middle of ridge by the old orchard nearly North of my house to the top of mountain, thence with line along top of the mountain to the line of the foregoing described line of George A. Early and with same and line of lands of A. Harrow and Black Harrow to the beginning;

I will to my son Josep Franklin the following described tract of land to wit: Beginning at spruce pine corner to the lot last described and with the lines of the same to the top of the mountain, thence with my line along mountain to the line of George Ramsay and with same to Ramsays corner near to the spruce pine corner, thence a straight line to said spruce pine corner herein mentioned I will that none of the before described tracts of land shall be sold or bartered away until my two youngest children to-wit, H. Hunter and Nora Frances arrive of age or are otherwise provided for, it of any one or more of the three George Thomas, Lydia, Leathairne or J. H.
