Do give grant & confirm unto <u>Cutlip Eariff</u> one certain tract or parcel of Land containing <u>one hundred and ninety acres</u> lying and being in the <u>County of</u> <u>Augusta</u> on the <u>South East side of Shenando River</u> and bounded as followeth as To wit, Beginning at two Pines and a Lynn on the bank of the river in <u>Fairfax's boundary Line</u> and running thence up the River and the several Courses of the same South eight Degrees West thirty four poles South ten degrees East seventy Poles South three Degrees West one hundred and forty four Poles to a Pine in a bent of the River South eighty-five Degrees East one hundred and forty two Poles to two red oakes and black oak on a high bank of the River North fifty two Degrees East (p 47) ninety eight Poles to two white oak and a black oak saplins in the boundary Line North forty six Degrees West two hundred and ninety eight Poles the Course of the boundary line to the Beginning.
